

My Mosler Biography:

Clifford C. Majors – I was hired by Nils Pearson in 1966 as an Electronics Technician serving PA, OH and West Virginia.

After Nils hired me, he said he was going to make me a manager. I told him I had all the managing I could stand as I had been in charge of four hundred apartments as Maintenance Manager. Nils left for places unknown shortly after I was hired. Bill Wise was transferred from the Cleveland office to replace Nils.

I attended several alarm, RTS and Management schools in Hamilton, Ohio. I installed many Sears and J. C. Penny alarms and became very efficient at it. This led to a trip to Texas to correct a problem with a J.C. Penny store and to install a J. C. Penny store in Puerto Rico with Al Ryan.

I was pursued for several months to become the Electronic Technician Supervisor in the Pittsburgh Office and finally gave in. I served in that position until I received a call from John Steiner in 1970 to be in Hamilton, Ohio by 5 o'clock that day. We met with Jack Smith and I was asked to relocate to Knoxville, TN.

I accepted the job and opened a new office to serve East Tennessee, parts of Virginia and Western North Carolina. With the help of Jim Simpson, the Knoxville office became very successful.

I left Mosler In 1978, for a private business opportunity. My son, Cliff, was a co-op student with Mosler and was hired full time when I left. He worked his way up the ladder to Branch Manager and closed the very office that I originally opened, when Mosler ceased operations.
